
## 2023 School Donation Scheme eligibility

The Ministry of Education operates a scheme where eligible schools are provided with a perpupil fund of \$154 granted each year with the agreement the school does not charge a 'school donation'. In the past, our school has been ineligible and requested a \$75 per child, or \$100 per family donation each year to assist with the curriculum costs we incur each year. You can see this would be of significant benefit to our school.

Linton Camp School is now eligible for this scheme and our school can 'opt-in' with the support of our parent community. The Board of Trustees have approved this scheme in concept. We will now survey our parent community in Week 1 of Term 4 to gauge our parents' support. We will look forward to everyone's responses.
